



Canadian Records Policy

Implementation Date: February 1997

Amendment Dates: Nov.'05 (#E.05)

The establishment and management of national level records is an integral part of sport. Records allow athletes and others to monitor performance progress, individually, and collectively. By compare and contrast athletes, and others, can set goals effectively. Accordingly,

1. The Technical Committee has the jurisdiction to approve Canadian Record applications without ratification of the Executive Board, or Congress. Congress will deal with any questionable issues as necessary.
2. Barefoot Records: Barefoot records can only be achieved at RC sanctioned events. Age division records do not require a review. Open division records require a review, except the World Championships. A review consists of the judges sheet and video from the event being reviewed by the WSWC Barefoot Committee.
